Considering Staff Papers Repository in NW OPAC

VB is a member of the Knowledge For Healthcare Repository Group.

VB proposed that MHL could make papers published by authors affiliated with NW mental health Trusts more accessible.

	<p>VB has spoken to Linda Ferguson about NWOPAC and possibility importing repositories. This is possible.</p> <p>ACTION: Speak to Linda Ferguson about the practicalities importing papers on to the OPAC.</p>	VB
6.	<p>Group Bids:</p> <p>Staff from across the NW are currently studying with GMMH. CBT and IAPT courses are offered via GMMH which are affiliated to UoM.</p> <p>Staff from most NW MH Trusts are requesting books on the course reading lists from their local NHS Libraries.</p> <p>VB suggested that this could be supported by a group bid.</p> <p>Discussions around submitting a bid and the time constraints associated with receiving the funding and placing an order.</p> <p>LA raised the issue of services without physical library spaces. LA will investigate whether a collection would be suitable for Pennine Care or whether a collection could be stored at Stockport/ Tameside/ Pennine Acute/GMMH.</p> <p>ACTIONS: Share CBT, CYP IAPT, CBT Psychosis reading lists Prepare and submit bid application Explore options for a collection of ebooks via EBSCO</p>	DL/JC DL/CS VB
7.	<p>E-Resources Experience Sharing</p> <p>LA has been doing some work at Pennine Care, identifying cost per download for journal titles in advance of renewals.</p> <p>LA asked the group whether they had any experience of gathering statistics from specific publishers.</p> <p>PO highlighted that NCUH have been trailing DynaMed Plus. Group discussed the difference in content between DynaMed and DynaMed Plus.</p> <p>PO has been using individual access to DynaMed during training sessions at NCUH. NCUH has access until January 2018 but will extend trial until February.</p> <p>PO felt that the MH coverage was good.</p>	
8.	<p>LQAF Experience Sharing</p> <p>General discussions around submissions and scores.</p> <p>DL raised that impact was still an issue for GMMH but that the joint MHL event had been useful.</p>	

	<p>Group discussed Food for the Mind promotion and some of the impact statements on the leaflets. DL raised whether these could be updated.</p> <p>VB mentioned that CWP LKS team had skills to be able to update FftM leaflets and that the promotion could be used to highlight the impact libraries have in MH.</p> <p>ACTIONS: Send out electronic copies of Food for the Mind leaflets.</p>	VB
	<p>News from our Trust</p> <p>Pennine Care</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • New Chief Executive appointed recently. • The Knowledge Service have run a Ted Talk themed event where an appropriate talk is shown at a lunch time. Staff attending the event are then invited to discuss the content of the talk and the team also ask evaluation questions. The talks last no more than 20 mins. <p>NW Partnership Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • New Knowledge and Library Services Manager- Tracy Owen. <p>Lancashire Care</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Invested in Knowledge Share. • Bid for funding to support a series of dementia boxes for the Trust. • Looking to conduct a library survey over the coming months. • The library is offering free tea and coffee to users and this has been popular but also relatively cheap to do. <p>Cheshire and Wirral Partnership</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CWP were successful in bidding for more PCs at their Education Centre in Chester. • The Library is involved in the STP agenda and work has been carried out by Vicky and her team which has been used by the STP boards. <p>Greater Manchester Mental Health NHS Foundation Trust</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Merging library management systems. • Holding a Human/Living Library event in February 2017 which will focus on inter-professional practice and knowledge sharing. • L&D will be funding Clinical Skills.net and the LKS will be working with the Lead Nurse for Meds Management and L&D to embed within practice. • Achieved first ever LQAF result as a new Trust and LKS.

11.	<p>Any Other Business</p> <p>Pennine Care are interested in categorising searches in terms of scope. There may be potential to save time of band 5s and 6s if basic searches</p>	

	<p>or enquiries can be passed to a band 4 to fulfil.</p> <p>The group discussed the fact that searches are often difficult to categorise and users may not know what level of search they require until advice is sought from a qualified or experienced member of LKS.</p> <p>Enquiries are becoming increasingly more complex and may not always be basic or simple to answer.</p> <p>In terms of recruiting a band 5 to Pennine, the group shared experiences of their own recruitment strategies. This included being flexible around the hours worked and potential to work from home.</p> <p>DL has created a driver summary for the Mental Health Workforce Plan for England from HEE. He will share with the group but would be interested in any feedback regarding the impact on MH LKS.</p>
