

Module Design

Accessibility - simple buttons which could be switched on and off at the beginning of each module.

ON OFF

Menu - icons included glossary, menu and progress visible on each page.



Navigation - the learner can work through the module and obtain a certificate or dip in and out using the quick links provided.



Interactivity - minimal text and embedded activities providing a search experience.




