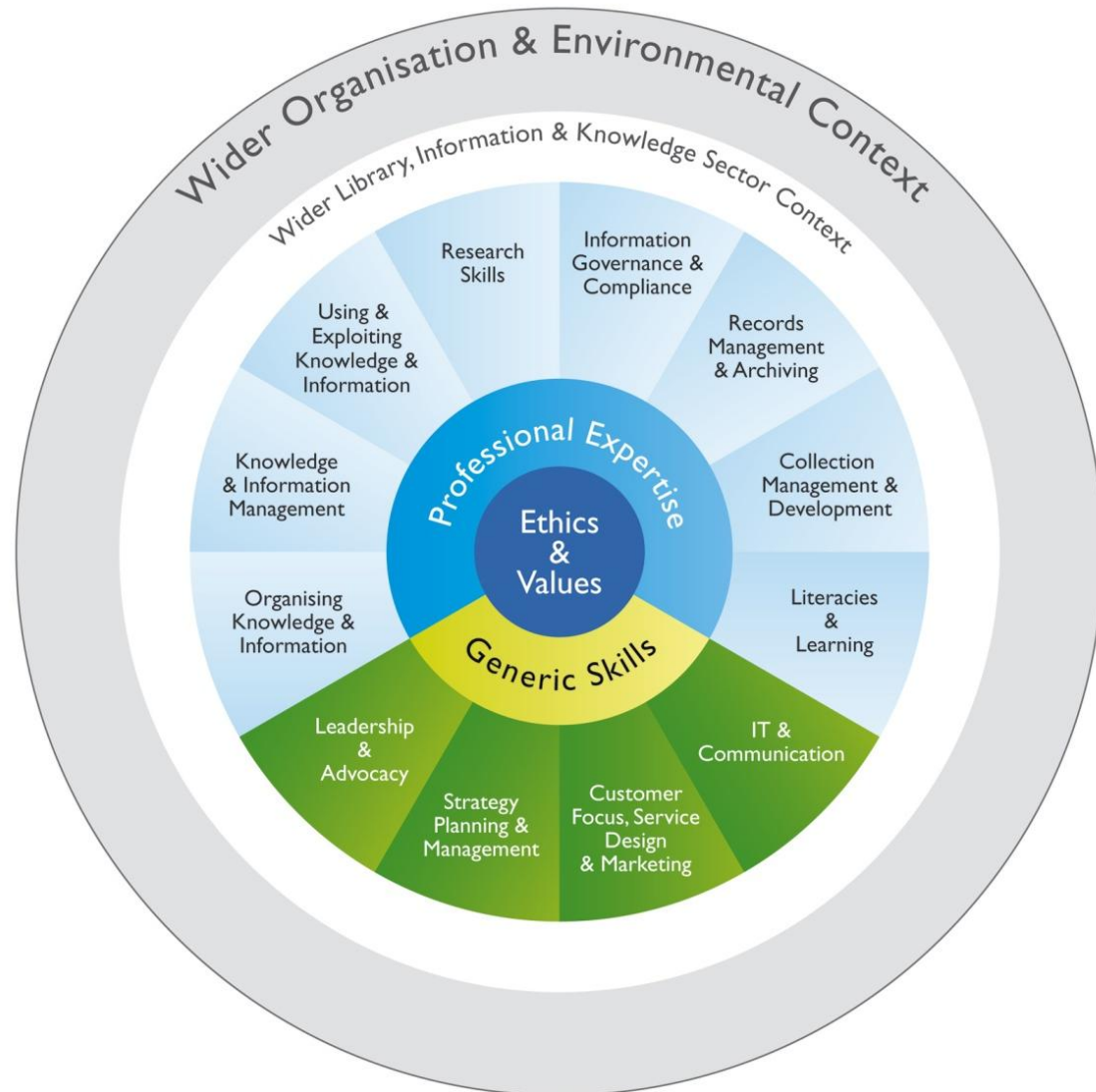

1. Organising Knowledge and Information

▶ *Organising all types of knowledge, information and other resources including the development and use of tools, strategies and protocols, and enabling these resources to be organised, searched and retrieved effectively. Includes cataloguing and classification, metadata and thesauri, subject indexing and database design. Within a health setting, organising knowledge and information is essential so that users have easy and convenient access to the evidence-base so they can improve patient care and safety.*

1.1 Information resources

Understanding the nature of information and of documents, theories and models; forms of information resources, and consequences for information organisation

▶ *Health Library and Knowledge Service (LKS) staff extend their reach beyond their own resources to understand the types of information and documents within the whole organisation and their role in making these easily accessible to those who need access to them*

1.2 File planning

Creating a single arrangement of resources to meet a particular need; includes knowledge resource planning

▶ *Health LKS staff may achieve this by the systematic arrangement of knowledge, for example by the creation of a Wiki or SharePoint site for nurse revalidation, or creation of an expert directory*


1.3 Classification schemes and taxonomies

Using forms of knowledge organisation which aim to show the relationships between concepts by bringing together terms representing similar meanings

▶ *This might mean using health specific classification schemes such as the National Library of Medicine (NLM) Classification or the Wessex Classification*

CILIP launched the Professional Knowledge and Skills Base (PKSB) in 2012 following extensive consultation with employers, the library, information and knowledge community and learning providers. Health Education England published Knowledge for Healthcare: a development framework for NHS library and knowledge services in England in 2014. Our two organisations have partnered to create this version of the PKSB to help the health sector develop the library and knowledge service workforce it needs for the 21st century.

The PKSB for Health outlines the broad range of skills required by librarians, information and knowledge professionals working in health. This version has been enriched with the addition of examples from a health setting throughout.
