


We're living in the early days of a revolution in the ways in which people use information and technology in their daily lives.



The library & information workforce is **79% female and 21% male***


But 47% of top earners are men







The **Health and Social Care Act 2012** establishes a duty on behalf of the Secretary of State for Health to ensure 'the use in the health sector of evidence obtained from research'.

It also places a responsibility on Clinical Commissioning Groups and healthcare providers to make use of the best available evidence in their decision-making.





Objective:

The objective of the **#AMillionDecisions campaign** is to encourage key decision-makers in the Healthcare sector to employ and make use of the skills of Library, Information and Knowledge Management Professionals in meeting their obligations under the *Health and Social Care Act 2012*.


