



- 4. To maintain research management that facilitates research, and ensures safety of research participants






To further increase our capacity and reputation for high quality research

We are a multidisciplinary collaborative bringing together a number of roles and skillset to help support staff put ideas into action. This may be via attendance to a formal session delivered by the R&D team or Library team or via one of the ACORN project workshops.

The site will hold a central register to capture CPD projects, formal dissertations and service evaluation projects.

By providing this visible register we hope to support staff to bring their learning back into the organisation.

This site will also feature opportunities for staff across all grades to learn about BDCFT projects that they may wish to be part of or indeed lead on.

We will also publish ongoing case studies and stories of success where staff have taken their ideas or findings from a service evaluation or dissertation and implemented them back into the practice setting using ACORN support to improve care/service or new ways of working be they big or small.
